As I write this, the evening November sun lies like magenta blush across the dark western skyline. Canadian geese beat their way back to the Rookery and warn us to get ready for winter while we warmly reflect on the summer past.

This season we were able to grow our fish crib total to 183 as well as cheer Robin Walsh's crew on as they added 50 tree falls. Eight tagged walleyes are still swimming in the lake, and we continue to track their movements in partnership with Wildland School students. A \$1,000 grant for native plants arrived from Eau Claire County, and Kristin Charlton has volunteered to chair the effort to apply the grant funds to the aeration lot sidehills. I am working with Marlo Orth of the Lake District to complete the transfer of the aeration operation and land to the district. The triathlon was a great success, and I am proud to announce our first annual golf tournament was sold out! Next summer the Triathlon is set for June 11 and the golf tournament for July 30. Our clothing sales on the web had an excellent start—many thanks to Duane Ives for his technical direction and help with our Facebook presence.

As Lake Altoona will be closed to ice fishing, please know that we have already asked DNR to reduce limits on our lake and to add more warden enforcement. If you are an ice fisherman/woman, please help protect the growing fish population we have worked so hard to build—take only enough fish you need to eat. Our lake cannot sustain everyone taking full limits day after day, taking more than a limit or coming back to take a second limit on the same day. Lake District News By: Marlo Orth

As everyone knows we had a high water event that lasted several days the first part of September. The trap at Troubled Waters Bridge did its job and took out a lot of sand. That's good and bad! Its good it took out all that sand but bad - now we have to clean it out again. The last time we cleaned it, it was during the winter when the ground was frozen. This provided several advantages:

- 1. Low water flow
- 2. Don't expect a flood event
- 3. Provide winter work for contractor
- 4. Don't tear up the dirt roads

Regarding the Gravel Pit Trap. As I write this, it is undecided whether we need to clean it, modify it or just wait and see what nature does. Now this winter we plan to clean the Troubled Waters Bridge trap for sure, what else, has not been determined.

Thanks to Kelly Jacobs, Eau Claire County Land Conservation Director, she secured a grant to do a study on the Eau Claire River Watershed. Our watershed is 565,000 acres and encompasses parts of five counties. Chris Straight from Fairchild, WI is coordinating the Eau Claire River Watershed Coalition study. They are using GIS and on the ground information to identify sources of nutrients (phosphorus) and sediment (sand and silt) that impact our lake.

Thus far three meetings have been held and another is planned for early December. Exact date is not set yet. This is a study and the best way to influence the outcome is to be involved in the process. Sign up for coalition email list: http://eepurl.com/bk7Rn5. Then come to meetings, make your voice heard so we get what is best, best for total watershed. Your Lake Association and Lake District leaders have been at these meetings and I can assure you have been very active in the process. But we also need you. We need your input. If you know of existing or proposed best management practices or projects that will reduce phosphorus and sediment loading to the water shed, please let Mr. Straight or myself know. Remember what happens in the watershed ends up in Lake Eau Claire.

To make improvements in the watershed involves dollars and labor. As an example, a farmer has a barn yard and the waste drains into a creek or stream. For him to fix this is very costly and he really has no incentive to do it. We have to convince him it would be healthier for his cows, a benefit for landscape and here's some money to help him. (This is only one example.)

With an Eau Claire River Watershed Coalition we would be eligible for larger and other grants that as a Lake District we would not be eligible for. That's a big reason for the Eau Claire Watershed Coalition. I encourage you to sign up and become active in the Watershed Coalition. Sincerely,

TREE DROPS 2015 By: Robin Walsh

On October 13th, Mike Lea and I volunteered to work along with Joe Gerbyshak, our DNR Fish Biologist, long time lake advocate, Buzz Sorge, and two sawyers from the DNR, Jason Meacham and Matt Simonson to cut 52 trees and drop them into the lake. We used 3/8 inch galvanized cable to secure the trees to shore. The cable and clamps cost came to just under 500\$, which was donated this year by an anonymous lake resident. The Lake Association also made a contribution to the DNR to cover just their basic labor and transportation. The DNR crew came well equipped with chainsaws, safety gear, cable cutters, and work boat. Joe also visited the lake back in August and marked the designated trees so the crew could get the job done in just one day. Many thanks to this very hard working crew!

Most of the tree drops were on County land on the Eastern end of the lake, in or close to "the rookery". Joe indicated this shallow water structure will give our spawning perch and musky a place to drape their eggs and will give juvenile fish habitat to find insects and protection. In addition, underwater trees serve as a carbon source that benefits everything from microorganisms to top predators.

Our Lake Management Plan calls for upwards of 200 Tree Drops in total so we hope to continue in 2016 and beyond. We are asking Lake Residents to consider having a Tree Drop on their property. The material and labor would be provided at no cost. The "ideal" candidate would be within 5 foot of the shoreline, have a lean towards the water, and be at least 25 foot from your property line or dock. We are especially interested in finding some trees that would reach water over 10 foot deep, so a steep dropping shore would be very desirable.

If you have a potential tree on your property for consideration or would like to offer financial help to cover the cost of materials and labor, please call me anytime at 286 5469 and I would be happy to visit your site and send a release form.



















