Fishing Regulations 101!

Over the last few years, fishing regulations on Lake Eau Claire have changed. Be sure to review the 2018-2019 regulations before hitting the water and remind friends/family of the regulations as well. For a full listing of regulations, visit https://cida.usgs.gov/wdnr_regs/apex/f?p=288:1:

General Waterbody Restrictions

Motor Trolling is allowed with up to 3 hooks, baits, or lures, per angler.

Fishing Regulations for Eau Claire Lake

NOTE: Regulations listed below may not reflect fish species actually found in the lake. See Eau Claire Lake's WDNR Lake Page for more information on this lake's characteristics

Fish	Season	Regulation
Catfish	Open All Year	No minimum length limit and the daily bag limit is 10.
Panfish (bluegill, pumpkinseed, sunfish, crappie and yellow perch)	Open All Year	No minimum length limit and the daily bag limit is 25, 25 panfish may be kept, but only 10 of any one species
Largemouth bass and smallmouth bass	May 5, 2018 to March 3, 2019	The minimum length limit is 14" and the daily bag limit is 5.
Muskellunge and hybrids	May 26, 2018 to November 30, 2018	The minimum length limit is 40" and the daily bag limit is 1.
Northern pike	May 5, 2018 to March 3, 2019	No minimum length limit and the daily bag limit is 5.
Trout	See specific regulations	http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/fishing/troutregs.html
Walleye, sauger, and hybrids	May 5, 2018 to March 3, 2019	The minimum length is 15", but walleye, sauger, and hybrids from 20" to 24" may not be kept, and only 1 fish over 24" is allowed. The daily bag limit is 3.







Boat transportation and bait laws (per WI DNR)

Wisconsin has various laws in place to prevent the introduction and control the spread of aquatic invasive species and diseases in Wisconsin.

Transport laws for boaters and anglers

- INSPECT your boat, trailer and equipment
- REMOVE any attached aquatic plants or animals (before launching, after loading and before transporting on a public highway).
- DRAIN all water from boats, motors and all equipment.
- NEVER MOVE live fish away from a waterbody.
- DISPOSE of unwanted bait in the trash.
- BUY minnows from a Wisconsin bait dealer. Use leftover minnows only under certain conditions.*

*You may take leftover minnows away from any state water and use them again on that same water. You may use leftover minnows on other waters only if no lake or river water, or other fish were added to their container (more information below).

It is time for another round of fish cribs to go in this June. We always need plenty of volunteers. Here is all the information:

When: Saturday, June 23 @ 8am

Where: Lake Eau Claire, North Shore Boat Landing

Who: Everyone is welcome, some heavy lifting is required

What: Bring a good pair of work gloves, a heavy pair of boots and an extra big hammer for crib building. If you prefer to work out on the pontoon placing the cribs, you will need to sign a waiver (see Fred Poss the day of) and bring a life jacket. Safety always come first!

How long: Typically, we finish building the cribs in about 2 hours (10am) and the pontoon crew is generally done around noon.

Our goal is install 20 cribs, which is 4 more than our usual 16.

HAY CREEK DREDGING INFORMATION

The Lake Eau Claire Association is again collaborating with the Lake Eau Claire Lake District government to continue cleaning out the creeks on the north side of our lake. As you may have noticed, we are trying out a new schedule, which we hope will best fit the flood conditions. This past year we decided to dredge out the two smallest creeks--Beach Creek and Bedpost Creek--in the late fall/early winter. This allows us to get the big trucks down into the swampy areas with the soil fairly dry and hard from frost. However, we are dredging Hay Creek in June in order to wait for the typical spring floods to pass first. This will allow us to capture the most amount of sediment after the flood and, hopefully, prevent major erosion to the landowner's backyard. Many thanks go out to the Marc Christopher family for allowing us access down into their backyard so we are able to clean out as much sediment as we can. The Lake District and Association hope to continue the investigation and development of a new Hay Creek Trap in the next year. The new trap would be located near or above the last house on Hay Creek, north of its delta that flows into Lake Eau Claire. Please know that your <u>continuing support</u> of the tax levy for the Lake District and your membership in and participation with the Lake Association provides us with the necessary funds to protect our lake from sediment and to keep the blue-green algae from ruining the water in the summer. Together we can accomplish what needs to be done!

Lake District News by Marlo Orth

During January and February of this year, Krueger & Stienfest of Antigo cleaned the sediment traps of both Troubled Waters Bridge Trap (TWBT) and Gravel Pit Trap (GPT). 12,600 cubic yards was dredged from TWBT, at a cost of \$99,980.00. 8,250 cubic yards was dredged from GPT at a cost of \$49,335. The material from TWBT was taken to our new deposit site on G. The cost of \$9,600 for land clearing, silt fence installation, tracking pad and other preparation work was entirely paid by the Lake Eau Claire Association. We are all very grateful and thankful to the Lake Association, because if they had not paid for the preparation of this new site, because of monetary constraints, we would not had sufficient funds to clean out GPT which would have resulted in more infilling of our lake. Just take a trip up to Skid Row and see what is happening and think how much worse this would be had we not been removing sediment before it gets to Skid Row. Sometime go look at the pile of sand at the Gravel Pit Deposit site. That is all sand that would be in our lake! Please know that your Lake Association and District Boards are working together co-operatively on all our lake projects. In addition, Eau Claire County is committed to do a 50-50- match this year on projects we do on Lake Eau Claire. For us to get these funds it is necessary for us to take the leadership role. I am so grateful for all the lake volunteers, towns of Bridge Creek, Ludington and their officials, and to Eau Claire County Board, Parks & Forest Departments, and Land Conservation Division for all their guidance and help. Thank You Everyone.

I have mentioned the Eau Claire River Watershed Coalition previously. The 9-Key Element document has been approved by both the EPA and DNR, which makes us eligible for grants that were not available previously. We have been awarded a small Xcel Energy Grant. Three educational students from UW-Eau Claire have taken this on as a service-learning project, to design an educational placemat that can be printed and distributed to restaurants in the watershed. The placemat will have information regarding our watershed on one side and some coloring and activities on the other. In the next month or two, we should see some of these placemats at some restaurants (restaurants that agreed to use them). Our thanks to Jacob Bauer, Jordan Duran and Lucas Weisenberger, UWEC students for their efforts on this educational project

Greg Leonard, Eau Claire County Land Conservation Supervisor and Jim Arch, Clark counties counterpart, submitted a joint application for a TRM grant for about one million dollars. Many facets to this grant, but Greg and Jim are heading this up for the watershed. Most of Eau Claire rivers watershed is in Clark and Eau Claire counties. We are in our infancy and just getting started, but with many people and agencies working together, we will be able to protect and improve our lakes, rivers and streams in the watershed.

Rod Zika is leading the effort to install a new, larger sediment trap further upstream than the one we currently have on Hay Creek. Many lake volunteers are helping in this endeavor. Eau Claire County Parks & Forest and Land Conservation divisions, the Wisconsin DNR are also actively involved in developing this new sediment trap. To design a trap that is efficient and cost effective is no small task. When we have high water, the water just roars down Hay creek (Muskrat Creek also). This all costs money and we can only do what we have manpower and resources to do. Many thanks to everyone for all your support.

HANGING TOGETHER! By Fred Poss

As we all approach another summer season on our beautiful lake, it is a good time to review some of the major accomplishments we have created together. It wasn't that many years ago our lake community decided to vote in a Lake District government with taxing authority. Of course, not everyone agreed with this and there were plenty of debates. However, the majority of lake families realized that the sedimentation of the lake and the cycles of unhealthy blue-green algae were slowly destroying the lake and its water quality. That decision was not an easy one to reach at the time, and the constant floods have strained our resources. Fortunately, the results of that decision have shown the importance of it for Lake Eau Claire. The big sand traps at the Gravel Pit and Troubled Waters Bridge have made an amazing difference. As

long as we continue to support those sand traps, the lake should be protected for a long time. Just as vital is the aeration of the deep end of our lake. Blue-green algae only lives on a bottom without oxygen. The aeration system provides the essential oxygen to the very deepest water and thus prevents the blue-green gunk from ever getting started. While the lake does have occasional ordinary algae blooms, the water no longer turns into a stinky pea soup that kills fish and animals alike while ruining the quality for swimming, boating and fishing.

The fact that we as property owners were willing to tax ourselves also allowed us the ability to apply for grants supported by county, state, and national governments and agencies. Some wanted the lake improvements,



but argued that "somebody else" should pay for them." It is so easy to forget that grant money does <u>not</u> arrive 100% free. Grants ordinarily come only to those who themselves are willing to provide an amount of matching money, typically 50%. Each year the Lake District has to apply to Eau Claire County for the \$100,000 supplemental money we receive. Eliminating or reducing our tax levy is an appealing idea for the short term but within a year, <u>whatever we reduce</u> will likely result in a corresponding reduction from the county--or even a loss of all county support. That is a risk we should never take. As Benjamin Franklin said to the delegates about to vote up the Declaration of Independence--" We need to all hang together, or...we will all hang separately."

This coming year, please make it a point to renew your lake association membership, to volunteer some of your time for association events like the triathlon or golf outing, to make it a point to stay informed about the lake and its issues, and most of all, to come to the annual meeting and continue supporting the efforts to rehabilitate and protect Lake Eau Claire.

Boat Parade Reminder!

Arrrrr! It'll be summer before you know it and it's time to start thinking about decorating those boats and pontoons for the 2018 boat parade. That's right mates, *Pirate Regatta XXIX* -- will be at 4 pm on the 4th of July. All you Independence Day buccaneers can float the fresh water high seas of Lake Eau Claire, take in the awards ceremony and free libations and still make it to supper before the fireworks. The parade takes about an hour but don't go straight home. There is an awards ceremony on Pirates Island — did we mention there's free libations.

There are two divisions, Frigates — that is for you pontoon owners. In addition, the Schooner division is for you boat people. Since 1988, we have suspended the entry fee and there is no reason to stop that now. First, 2nd and 3rd prizes are awarded in each division. First prize is always a handsome oak plaque that beautifully enhances the wall of any LEC house or cabin and gives the winners bragging rights for years to come. Second and third prizes get a combination of money and libations. In 1988, to promote Pirate lore, we actually awarded silver coins, but by popular demand, we now award prizes in US currency. The Pirates issue a proclamation to all winners, celebrating their creativity and achievement.



Last year, we had 20 units in the parade: 17 pontoons and 3 boats, making it easier to win in that division. Still, we need more boats. The highest number of units (at least since 1988 — that is how long the Pirates have been leading the parade) was 36 units in 1990. The lowest was 15 in 2013. The weather is almost always nice -- there was only one year where we did the parade in a driving rain and that was in 2010 and that year we had 19 units. And that says a lot about the determination of Lake Eau Claire boat paraders. One year — 1997 — the event was cut short when a huge thunderstorm (some say it was a tornado) interrupted the event. We still had the award ceremony, just 2 hours late.

Get the jump on the parade and start planning your theme. There is always stiff competition, especially for Frigate captains and crew. We could always use a judge or two. And arrrrg!, if you have questions, call, Commodore Chris Nelson 715.497.9939 or Admiral Mike O'Connor 715.577.2269.
