

Lake Eau Claire Boat Landings

The Parks & Forest Department with Eau Claire County is/was aware of Lake Eau Claire's boat landing issues prior to spring. We are excited to announce that the county did some repair work in early May. They coordinated having the highway department fix the slabs and also patch the approaches. They are not sure if this will be a permanent/temporary fix or not, but hopefully it will make things easier and safer for boaters. There are some larger renovations planned on the lake's landings planned in the near future.

The Parks & Forest Department has applied for a recreational boating grant to fix the North landing on a permanent basis. The grant application will be evaluated in July and if awarded, they will plan on fixing that landing later this fall. The South landing will be budgeted for a major renovation in 2024. They are hoping to get some money through the capital budget process and possibly another recreational boating grant to help with the funding.

If you feel like this would be a good project and one that you and others could support, please help voice your opinion when the county budget hearings come up later this summer. The more community support for these projects the better!

Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources

Hey, boaters!

Parts of Wisconsin ended a desert-like May with next to no rain. That means some rivers and lakes have low water levels. Lower water levels change boating conditions, making it even more important to be aware of your surroundings and why you should always wear your life jacket.

Keep your speed down and maintain a lookout. The low levels can make docking at a fixed pier difficult, if not impossible. The levels also can



reveal more sandbars, which may look solid but are always forming or dissolving with the current. It also can be possible to run any watercraft aground in an area normally considered safe for travel. Rains or a dam release can change conditions suddenly for the boater.

Be prepared for the unexpected. That includes things you can't see beneath or at the water's surface, like floating debris and shifting rocks. Check the weather forecast and conditions before your outing, such as with outfitters or fishing clubs for local water levels.

ADEQUATE CLEARANCE FROM WILDFIRES AND FOR FIREFIGHTERS



The home ignition zone is your home and its surroundings out to 100-200 feet. In this area, vegetation and personal property should be managed and maintained to reduce ignitability and improve the likelihood of your home surviving a wildfire with little or no assistance from firefighters.

Will a fire truck fit down your driveway? In the event of a wildfire in your area, firefighters may need to reach your home. If firefighters cannot safely access your home, they will find an alternative way to get to you that may take longer – and when fighting fire, every second counts.

KEEP TROUT FISHING SIMPLE

I haven't written about trout fishing in other newsletters because almost everyone immediately thinks of fishing Lake Eau Claire for its walleye, muskie and bass. But our area contains some great trout streams, too...like the Buffalo River, for example. And if fishing for trout is a budding interest, here is a way to get started...simply.

For most situations a fly rod works best, even if you are just swinging a chunk of nightcrawler and a sinker or two. A fly rod 8 to 9 feet in length, in a 4 or 5 weight category, paired with a 3X to 5X leader (tippet) is a great starter outfit. When it comes to fly lines, if you are just learning, a double taper line is practical as it can be reversed on the spool to last twice as long and should be easy to cast.

I could write many articles about specific flies to use in this area, but to keep things simple I recommend some kind of ant, mayfly, mosquito, and nymph. My favorites include a muskrat's regret nymph (made out of muskrat hair), a royal coachman, a black ant, and some kind of grey or black-looking mosquito in sizes 10 to 16 should get you off to a good start.

Lake District Update – Sugar's Landing Upgrades and High Water Mike Lea - District Chairman

Five weeks of sustained high water put last winter's dredging and sedimentation traps to the test. Fortunately, ongoing trap maintenance kept the worst of the sediment out of the main body of Lake Eau Claire once again. Small watercraft can now generally navigate from the Eagle's Nest to Troubled Water's bridge, and up Muskrat Creek. At Hay Creek, the delta is mostly clear, and you can navigate into the bay. You might even pick up a small walleye or two in the weed beds. For those looking to navigate up the eastern section of the Eau Claire River, the sand delta at Skid Row remains an obstacle, although careful navigation along the shoreline can get you almost to the Skid Row Boat Landing. We plan to tackle that this winter. The Eau Claire County Parks and Forest Department also has long range plans for upgrades at all three public boat landings (Northside, Southside, and Skid Row) in the coming years.

Mark your calendars now for The Lake Eau Claire Rehabilitation District Annual Meeting Saturday, August 19, 2023, at 2pm. This year the meeting will be conducted at the Pavilion at Lake Eau Claire County Park on Highway SD and free parking passes will be provided for attendees. The clubhouse is undergoing renovation and reconstruction, so we will conduct the District meeting at the Pavilion, which will be followed by the Friends of Lake Eau Claire Summer Picnic. This meeting provides important updates on the work that was completed in the last year, planned interventions for the upcoming year, and gives members an opportunity to vote on the mill rate and other important decisions for the District. This is a great way to meet your neighbors and friends who support our lake. More details about the agenda for the District meeting will arrive via mail and email. We hope to see you there.

Sugar's Landing needed additional tidying and repair after the Hay Creek dredging project. With help from Willie Thomas, a local contractor, the landing looks better than ever. Willie spent several days scraping mud off the road and reshaping the landing. He brought in gravel, planted grass, and continues to visit regularly to ensure the landing area is stable. One concern is that with the new popularity, vehicles are parked in the turn-around area that is designated for launching a boat. Please do not park in the loop area of Sugar's Landing as this area needs to remain clear to pull around to launch a boat.


