

# **Deep Water Fish Cribs**

Last fall, we experimented with a new style of fish cribs (see example to the left), commonly called deep water cribs. The deep-water cribs were placed in water that is 12-14 feet deep. These cribs are designed to provide cover and protection for smaller fish and give them a place to reproduce. The deep water cribs were made from untreated

pallets and had cinder blocks attached to them to get them to sink. It took two tries to get the cribs to sink as they required more weight than anticipated! There were three cribs placed this fall and a few more are ready to be dropped this year; pending a few modifications to help them sink faster! We'll also be looking at our shallow water cribs and other deep water crib designs as we continue to create



habitat to support our fish population. Stay tuned for more information and more ways to get involved!



#### Lake District Update - Hay Creek Dredging

A significant Lake District project on the wish list was completed this winter. The delta clean out at the mouth of Hay Creek (north side near Sugar's Landing) has been a priority for several years. This project became a reality thanks to the support of the Friends of Lake Eau Claire and the generosity of additional private donors.



The extra funds were allocated for the contractor, Krueger Steinfest, to open the east and west channels on Hay Creek and remove as much of the sediment delta as possible. They accessed the area from Sugar's Landing at the end of Highway NL and used the accumulated sand to build a platform for the equipment to work from. Initial work on the east channel progressed as planned, but the contractor ran into trouble near the west channel. Instead of pure sand, which forms a solid base for the extremely heavy equipment to work on, the west side of the delta was made up of dark, soft, topsoil runoff.

This softer sediment was not firm enough to hold up equipment, so dredging up the west channel was not possible.

A last minute adjustment was made to make up for not cleaning the west channel. We elected to instead remove additional sediment from the delta. The permanent trap upstream of the east and west channel on Hay Creek, combined with a new deeper area below the creek mouth, should promote the scouring of the remaining sediment in the channel with normal water flow. As a bonus, the contractor removed sediment from the boat ramp at Sugar's Landing to make launching this spring easier.



Muddy silt remains frozen to the pavement as I write this. There is a plan to remove this when it thaws. We appreciate the cooperation from ice anglers, snowmobilers, and other users in avoiding the area during the crucial work.

Once the ice is out, take a boat ride to the mouth of Hay Creek and check out the progress. With luck, this new hole will become the next fishing hot spot. See you out there!

# SPREADING THE GOOD WORD by Fred Poss

In the 2011-12 calendar year, our lake association laid down plans to address three critical problems: (1) the sedimentation of the lake bottom, (2) the blue-green algae pollution of the water, and (3) the low fish population. Of

course, all three issues crossed over into one another. The lake filling up limited the amount of deep-water fish could use as a refuge. The blue-green slime made breathing a real challenge for big and little fish alike. And, finally, the lake had little weed and almost no natural woody habitat to provide shelter and spawning areas for our fish.

Now it is 2023, and the positive plans and action steps we undertook a decade ago have not only paid off for our lakethe good word about Lake Eau Claire has begun to spread to other area lakes too.


Three years ago, a committee from Lake Altoona contacted me inquiring into how we constructed our half-log fish cribs and what legal steps were necessary to install cribs like ours in their lake. Fast forward to today, and I am happy to report that with a little coaching and a manual I wrote on how to make them, their fish committee has initiated a nice fish crib building and installation process (see photos).

And the hits just keep coming! Last week Kevin Rogalinski, from Lake Como in Bloomer, contacted me for information and help. Joe Gerbyshak, our regional DNR fish manager, had suggested Kevin and company contact me because Lake Como



has similar shallow characteristics to our lake. Anyway, to make a short story shorter--Kevin and I have been in close contact. I've shared how-to build information, location preferences, materials to use and even landowner permission forms. Today, Wednesday, March 1, Kevin is holding his first planning meeting in Bloomer. This development just goes to show that our original plans and efforts were based on good science and sound thinking. Don't be afraid to share our success story with other lakes too.
